




This analysis indicates the key to prospering financially is to fly, fly

Treasurer's Kudos to Brian for arranging Green Tow as a backup




We've been averaging 19 tach hrs/month since September and seem to be recovering financially

Cut that amount of flying in half and we're living on the edge, even with minimal insurance costs



The analysis also shows how current quote for glider physical damage insurance provides limited margin, even operating at 19 tach hrs/month

ARTICLE X Other Club Regulations

Section I Flight Rules—The NCSA, through he Board of Directors, shall promulgate flight rules for the use of all club members. Each member shall receive these rules and shall return a statement acknowledging a willingness to abide by those rules. The Board of Directors shall, at its discretion, amend and revise the Flight Rules as appropriate.

Section II Damages—In the event of damage to club equipment from an accident, the member(s) responsible for the equipment at the time shall be liable for a maximum of the insurance deductible. In the event of an accident caused by gross or willful negligence (as determined by the Board of Directors), the damage accrued from operation of Club equipment, in excess of the protection afforded by insurance carried by the Club, is the responsibility of the individual involved. The Club will carry such appropriate insurance as directed by the Board of Directors. In the event of damage to club equipment from an accident those member(s) responsible for the accident shall pay an amount specified in the NCSA Flight Rules in effect at the time of the accident.

History of NCSA glider physical damage claims in last 16 years.

2009- KP's tailboom broken in off field landing during ASI Thermal Camp by recently rated pilot not endorsed for XC but flying XC and grossly violating conservative XC rules ~\$20K

2014- Student clobbers 81C's left wing on runway exit sign on first solo trying to do a fancy exit (pilot attempting to mimick what he saw in training) \$6K

2015- KP's rear canopy mysteriously becomes cracked while in trailer. \$6K

2022- KP's front canopy opens after take-off on a remain-on-runway, rapid turn around student flight. \$11K.

Total: about \$43K over 16 years. Roughly \$5K/year adjusted for inflation.

Most of that is avoidable








Unplanned landouts:


